



Student Role

- Demonstrate responsibility for your own education and success
 - Meet with your Advisor <u>every</u> semester
 - Come to advising meetings prepared with an academic plan
 - Notify your advisor in advance if you have concerns
- <u>Communicate</u> with instructors and advisors on a regular basis
- Be organized and PLAN ahead
 - Maintain passing grades (GPA 2.0 or higher) to remain in academic good standing





Connections are Important

Academic Advisor – Each student is assigned a faculty advisor. This is the person that assists you in developing an academic plan and registering for classes.

PACE Coach – Coaches assist students in balancing commitments, juggling responsibilities, understanding options, or academic "problem solving". Each student will be assigned a coach.


Faculty – These are your instructors. They are your best academic resource and want to see you succeed, but you have to do the work!





ACCess Email – This is the College's primary source of communication with students and you will be held accountable for the information sent to you. Please READ your email!



Watermark (Aviso) Student - Aviso is an early alert and student tracking tool accessible on the ACC website and via the Watermark Student Mobile App. Through Watermark, students, faculty, and staff will be notified of academic performance through automated alerts, messaging, and tasks.



Moodle – This is a software that faculty may ask you to use to complete class assignments and check grades. Instructors may use it for just a few assignments or for all assignments.




Student Self-Service – This is your student portal to all things ACC (account balance, advisor contact, class schedules, financial aid information, and graduation applications, and transcript requests)

Financial Aid

How do I apply?

- Complete the FAFSA online at FAFSA.gov
- If you need assistance, contact the Financial Aid office at <u>financialaid@alamancecc.edu</u> or 336-506-4340
- Complete additional documents requested by the Financial Aid Office

What do I need?

- Tax Return (include your parents' if you are under the age of 24)
- W-2 forms
- Social Security Number
- Create your FSA ID



IF You Need to Make a Change

- Add/Drop Period first four days of the semester
- Once classes have begun, you cannot receive a full reimbursement.
- Withdrawing from a course after the Add/Drop period may have serious consequences for Financial Aid, Veteran's Benefits, and program completion dates. Please do not withdraw without speaking to a PACE Coach and a staff member in Financial Aid / Veterans Office!



What is SAP and How Does it Affect My Financial Aid?

- Satisfactory Academic Progress
- SAP is run at the end of each semester
- To remain in "good standing", you must <u>maintain a 2.0 GPA</u> on a 4.0 scale and <u>complete 67%</u> of classes you have enrolled in (completion rate, CR)

Ex. You enroll in 4 classes at 3 credits each = 12 credits

If you withdraw from one class (3 credits) you complete 9 of 12 credits

= 75% CR

If you withdraw from two classes (6 credits) you complete 6 of 12 credits = 50% CR

- If you fail to maintain these minimum standards, your Financial Aid package will be suspended and you may have to file an appeal or pay out-of-pocket.
- To be awarded scholarships you must maintain a GPA of 2.0 or higher and have a 75% completion rate.


