ACC Foundation Innovation Grants Enhance Learning

Each year the ACC Foundation awards Innovation Grants up to \$10,000 to faculty and staff who apply with proposals for projects to enhance the ACC learning environment.

An excellent example of one 2024-2025 grant now helping students in their studies is "Figure It Out," submitted by Fine Arts instructor Chad Godt. The Foundation funded three poseable anatomical skeleton models representing various stages of life for his art classes. These skeleton models are a critical part of the Associate in Fine Arts transfer program's required Visual Arts classes.

Said Chad: "Students now have the opportunity to explore realistic proportions of the human anatomy in all life stages. The three models show



how the human figure changes as people grow, and how proportions change. This allows for students to grow and become stronger artists."

ACC Foundation Funds Free Link Bus Service for ACC Students and Employees

The ACC Foundation has partnered with the City of Burlington to provide free bus service for all of the college's students and employees on Link Transit buses.

The agreement stipulates that the ACC Foundation will reimburse Link Transit for the fares, using gifts from generous individuals and organizations throughout our community and beyond.

To qualify for the unlimited ridership on all routes, ACC students must be currently enrolled, and ACC employees must show their valid ID card to the bus operator.

The agreement is effective from February 1, 2025 through June 30, 2025, with an option to mutually extend the partnership, depending on usage.

"The ACC Foundation works every day to remove barriers for student access, completion and success. Transportation can be one of those barriers. The ACC Foundation is pleased to support this partnership," said Carolyn Rhode, Executive Director of the Foundation."

Link Transit buses run 5:30am-9:30pm M-F, and Saturdays 9:30am-6:30pm.

Duke Energy Presents ACC Foundation with \$10,000 Gift to Support Scholarships



The Duke Energy Foundation awarded the ACC Foundation with a \$10,000 gift to support scholarships for workforce development training, with a focus on underrepresented populations.

The Duke Energy funding ensures the ability of the Foundation to provide scholarships, including tuition, books, and supplies, to low income students. The Duke Energy gift stipulates preference be given to students in energy-related sectors, including advanced manufacturing and cyber-security. Other forms of support will be provided through emergency assistance grants, childcare grants and work-study programs.

The longtime partnership between Duke Energy and ACC has included a \$97,500 River Resources Grant in 2019 that helped return part of the lower campus to its original native prairie environment, which serves as a riparian buffer to the adjacent Haw River.

The Duke Energy Foundation is the charitable foundation of Duke Energy Corporation and represents the integration of multiple foundations from its predecessor companies.
